Winter holidays are important all around the world and everyone celebrates a little differently. Students will discover traditions of Hanukkah, Bodhi Day, Diwali, Winter Solstice, and Bruce County's Christmas past through songs, games, activities, and crafts.



A Day in the Life of a Pioneer Child (half or full day)

*Mobile year-round, on-site until Oct 9 & after May 18.

Experience what life was like for early settler children! Students will spend time in our historical log buildings - an authentic setting for experiencing daily pioneer chores, schoolwork, games, and crafts.



Ancient Civilizations (in-person full day, mobile half day)

*Mobile year-round, on-site select dates in April.

An immersive activity-based introduction to a variety of early societies from 3000 BCE – 1500 CE. Be a blacksmith, illuminator, create brass rubbings, learn about mythology, write in ancient Maya numerals, and barter on the silk road!



Remembering Our Own (half day)

Discover WWI through the eyes of a Bruce County soldier. Interact with a special selection of artifacts and archival material to discover what life was like at the front and for those left at home



Anishnaabwe Endaat (half day)

Students will learn about Indigenous ways of knowing and learning and connecting to the land through storytelling, discussion, games and art creation in our Anishnaabwe Endaat gallery.



The Great Outdoors (half day)

Come learn on the Fairy Lake trail from the greatest teacher of all: Mother Nature. This program can be catered to most grades' Understanding Life Systems strands and is popular in the spring.



"Scene" the Bruce (full day)

Explore historical fiction and act out your knowledge. Classes will focus on the elements of a story as they write and star in their own short skits using the exhibits as their sets.
